Literary genres, for me, are like the flavors used in crafting a fine meal or dessert. Too much of any one taste leaves you feeling a bit overwhelmed, like the meal was one-note and not very complex. The very best of them (meals and stories) combine sweet, savory, salty, sour, and umami to create a balanced masterpiece.

When carrying this analogy over to literature, that need for balance still applies. Horror is glorious, but so much better when tempered with a little romance to raise the stakes, a little self-discovery to make characters relatable, and a little humor to cleanse the mental palate from time to time.

My very favorite horror movies and shows introduce elements of humor which humanize the characters and take the edge off between emotional trauma, physical danger, and spirals of fear. I mean, what would THE LOST BOYS be without, "Death by stereo!"

This is rarer in books, though you'll get an amusing side character in a Stephen King novel. Some entire series, though, like the GOOSEBUMPS books, sprinkle humor in like a fine spice that's ultimately inseparable from the dish as a whole.


